## From The President's Desk

Last month, I said I was going to do 2022 over again, starting with my drive to Florida to drop my mother and her dog off there for the winter. She didn't want to put her Jack Russell Terrier - Archie - through the difficulties of flying. You may recall that we did this last year, and I managed to break the suspension of Wife-Sue's BMW 7-Series taking a short-cut around Atlanta on the drive home.

This year, Sue said that she was coming with me. She said she had vacation time to use up for work, but you know she really wanted to see what I was doing to her car.

We were a bit nervous, because Hurricane lan had passed almost overtop of my mother's Florida home 2 months earlier. We didn't have a lot of information about the damage it caused. A few people were back in her mobile home park, and some were complaining about flood damage, but her's was not on any list of destroyed homes.

When we arrived, we saw that damage appeared to be minimal. Her 30 year old roof was missing a few shingles, an eaves trough was missing, and the vinyl siding and skirting were pulled away. Otherwise, all was good! No water incursion, no mold, and the air conditioner turned on.

Next up was hooking up her car battery and starting the car after it had been sitting for 6 months. Hmm. The battery sparks, but it's not turning over. Get out the booster cables. Same result. Nothing. The car is dead.

Also, the interior was "moist". Wet carpet smells, water pooled in spots on the rubber mats. We called the CAA/AAA, and waited for a tow truck. In the mean time, we chatted with the locals. There were reports of 3-4 feet of water on the roads. It came in a flash, and drained away just as quickly. We noticed a high-water mark on the front door that would put it at about 2' deep around the car.

AAA finally showed up at 9:30pm, and we instructed them to take the car to the local dealership to see if how serious the damage was. They were to drop the keys in the Service drop box. The tow truck driver was telling me all sorts of horror stories. "All the flood damaged cars are going to Tallahassee. There are so many, they don't know what to do with them. Are you sure you want it to go to the dealer?"

The next day, we called the dealer. No sign of any car.

We called the insurance. My mother had cancelled all insurance except for Fire and Theft. And her policy was up for renewal. She didn't know if she should call the police to report it stolen, or let the insurance try to find it, or wait for AAA to track it down. All this was happening the weekend before US Thanksgiving.

After many phone calls, and almost 2 weeks elapsed, AAA reported that the car had been found - in the Used Car lot at the dealership. The keys were still in it. Also, Fire & Theft insurance includes flood damage. My mother had almost accepted someone's offer of \$300 for the car. Luckily she checked with us, and we told her to wait for the insurance to sort this out. She should get close to \$10,000 instead.

She has since found out that the flood had washed away the air conditioning ducts under her home, so she only had A/C in the room closest to the outside A/C unit. She was able to get that repaired, but contractors are so busy there are lots of delays, and prices are 50% higher than normal. But the siding was an easy fix, and she is just waiting for her new roof.

Sue and I headed back to Canada. I had told Sue that I was going to show her the Tail of the Dragon - the alternate way home

if you drive through the mountains at the Georgia/North Carolina/Tennessee border. I had raced home after the car repairs last year, so it was a quick drive-by. This year, Sue said "Why don't we stay 2 nights instead of 1, and we can spend the day driving in the area." This is why I love her!

She found a BnB not far from the Dragon, and we headed there from Florida. While heading up I75, a dozen supercars flew past us. We counted 3 Ferraris, 2 McLarens, 2 Porsches, a Bentley SUV, and more. They all have "Fast Life Rally" and #ReturnoftheDragonRally2 decals.

Sue yells "Quick! Get your phone. We need to get this on video."

They blew past us, so we missed the chance to grab some photos, but I said "I think we'll see them again - tomorrow."

The BnB was super: A large log home, run by a couple from Canada who fell in love with the North Carolina mountains.

The next day, we drove all over. We found the town of Highlands full of boutiques, but the area was really just gorges. The roads were amazing - lots of elevation change and twisty bits as you run along the passes (gaps) between 3 states. We headed for a nice hotel for dinner, very close to Deal's Gap, where the Dragon starts on the North Carolina side. As we pulled into the parking lot, there were all the "rally" cars.


A few people were taking pictures, so we parked Sue's 7er at the end of the line and posed with them. Sue made me move the car before the owners came out.

The next day, we headed out, drove the Dragon one last time, and made good time returning home.

My mother ended up having her Canadian Toyota Corolla driven down to Florida, so she will have my sisters drive it back in the spring when she returns. She is expecting me to drive it down next year, with Archie, then fly back. I told her the only way I would do that is if we came down via the Tail of the Dragon. It's time for her to get a BMW.



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## 2022 FIA ECO Rally Cup - The ECO Dolomites GT

Hello to all TAC members,

On November 17th-19th, 2022 we took part in the last round of 2022 FIA ECO Rally Cup at the ECO Dolomites GT in Fiera di Primiero, Italy. This time our team was represented by Piotr and Lukasz Nytko, Piotr as a driver and Lukasz took the spot of the co-driver.

Nytko Motorsport has taken part in FIA Eco rallies since 2013, representing FIA Canada ASN and TAC on this international motorsport stage. I'm sure some members will still remember our victory at the 2014 Rallye Monte Carlo EN in Monaco with our Toyota Yaris Hybrid.

Since 2016, the Cup has changed to electric and hydrogen cars only. This caused significant effort in securing a vehicle for this event and thanks to Daniel Campisi, who lent us his personal Tesla Model X for the rally, we were able to compete in Italy.

Now, some info about the rally; 3 days of a competition were divided into 4 legs, with 4 separate Road Books which were handed out only an hour before the start. The 441 km route was from Fiera di Primiero - Ortisei - Fiera di Primiero, with 17 regularity stages and average speeds between 36 till 41 km/ h. Amazing roads with fantastic mountain views which at times distract you during the stages especially when viewed from the helicopter like cockpit of the Tesla. Some road sections were already snow covered adding to the difficulty of the event. The organiser also added some extra excitement by making the transit section a bit short on time so reaching the checkpoints required some creative driving:)

Our performance was very good given being unfamiliar with the car. We were able to achieve second place on one stage and stayed in the top 10 on the rest of the stages. We experienced some technical difficulties at

the beginning of the event when our Terra Trip rally computer lost GPS signal. Quick thinking and the navigational part we did using a spare iPad while Regularity Stages we



utilized our Rallymeter app.

Thanks to fantastic organisers and wonderful scenery, this event is on top of our list in the European regularity rally calendar, not to mention fantastic Italian hospitality and family atmosphere.

The event also had a very good number of international entries with 18 top teams from all over the Europe and us from Canada:) It was nice to see our fellow competitors, after such a long time, some of them we have known personally for almost 10 years now.


The final result for us - 1st place in Tesla Class, 10th place in Regularity Classification, 12th place in Performance Index, 13th place Combined regularity and energy consumption.
