The Year Ahead

2006. Another year. Where does the time go?

Plans are underway for another busy year. We want to ensure that no-one feels that they're just sitting around with nothing to do!

The January Jaunt has come and gone. Congrats to Kurt Seelenmayer for getting 23 teams out this year.

Our monthly meetings are regular occurrences, and take place the third Wednesday of the month. We are lucky to have a place like Miami's Restaurant that hosts us, and gives us their party room downstairs. Please support them by ordering a drink, snack, or meal when you come out to our meetings. Their food is excellent.

Now that we have Chuck Atkins on as Social Director, you can pass on any ideas for meeting activities to him. If anyone has any interesting Rally or Race tapes, we can play them at the close of the business part of the meeting. I know Chuck would be interested in any suggestions for guest speakers.

The Ice Race season is now upon us. I'd encourage everyone to come out and race, watch, beg for a ride, or otherwise assist. TAC members always put on a strong show, and we host a great event. The Ice Race season begins on January 14, with events every weekend. TAC hosts the last event on February 25/26. I can't think of a better way of getting your money's worth out of a \$500 car.

In February, the Canadian International Autoshow will be back in Toronto. CASC will again have a booth that will be shared with Rally Sport Ontario. Both organizations will be looking for volunteers. This is a great way to meet potential competitors and let them know about our club and the events we participate in. We'll have TAC membership forms and trifold information sheets to hand out.

In early April, TAC will be at the Solo Open House at CSC Racing in Newmarket. We usually sign up a bunch of new members there, and all our Solo 1 and Solo 2 competitors can get their cars classified, and register for this year's events.

Also starting in April will be our Ralliette series. Numbers have been increasing over the last couple of years, and we're seeing teams move from Novice to Intermediate to Expert. This year, we're hoping to have a joint award with the Maple Leaf Rally Club. Our Ralliette series runs on the forth Wednesday of each month, and MLRC runs their Mini-Rally series once a month on a Saturday. Each series will have their own champion, but we'll also have a combined championship. Competitors must run a minimum number of events in each series to qualify. The Ralliettes will keep competitors busy through October.

The May Solo 1 School will again be held on the first weekend in May - May 7/8. This is a great weekend to get lots of track time with some excellent instructors. The rest of the Solo 1 season follows, with events every 2-3 weeks. Specific dates are still up in the air, but we're hoping to get confirmation of 1 or 2 Big Track weekends at Mosport, a Calabogie school, a Shannonville weekend, and a return to the Toronto Motorsport Park at Cayuga. We're hoping that Quebec can host the Solo Sprint Canadian National Championships this year.

TAC will again be hosting a Solo 2 event at the Powerade (formerly Brampton) Centre. The date is to be confirmed, but this is always a popular event on the Solo 2 championship calendar.

We'll watch for the Discover Ontario Rally at the end of May or beginning of June. Mitch and Brook will be back organizing another popular event in the Road Rally Series. Of course we'll be organizing a few Contract Rallies, making a few dollars for the club, and spreading the word on how much fun rallying can be.

I'm hoping to participate in a few Regional Races this year, in the Touring/GT series as well as the Sprint races. My dedicated track car should be ready in April, so I'll be out at the race events looking for the TAC members that I've met at Solo events, and have now moved on to door-to-door racing. Even though TAC won't be organizing any Race events this year, we'll still be out participating!

The ALMS race is back at Mosport for the Labour Day weekend. The TAC Corral was a big success last year, so we'll be back again in 2006. Last year's gourmet meal was amazing. John Hannaford and Deb Phillips did a tonne of work to pull that off, and we're looking to get them some help this year.

Then in December we'll have our 51st Christmas/Holiday Dinner. We'll hold off on the Royal York, but I'm expecting the event will still be lots of fun as we wrap up the season.

And somewhere before the end of the year, we'll hold our AGM, elect some directors, and plan the 2007 January Jaunt!

I can't believe we're planning 2007 already. Where does the time go!




DYNO DAZE??

2006 January Jaunt Results

Event Report

As the only winter Navex in Ontario, the Jaunt provides a unique combination of driving and navigating challenges. This year was no different. The rally gods smiled on us again, delivering a snowfall just in time for the event, with healthy snowy weather throughout the night as well that added to the spirit of the rally.

Every competitor finished the rally this year, the first time in the recent (3 year) January Jaunt history. Car 19 found a little mud off-route, and decided to head to the finish after getting out, but by checking in at the final control, they still finished the rally. A few other crews got lost, and I heard that there were a few frustrations, but everyone recovered, and I hope that all had a good time overall!

The Novice entry in this event topped even last year's entry of 13, with 15 crews entered! There could be a number of reasons for this, but I think that the location, length, and timing of the event add to its appeal. Some competitors like to use the Jaunt as a shakedown for the other winter rallies later in the season, although all crews opted for regular ORRC classes rather then the available Open class (where experienced crews can run with Novice instructions).

The Novice class was given "Easy" instructions this year, although there were a couple of sections that proved to be not so easy after all. Novices were challenged by the last section, a flow chart with added distances to help guide the way through. We used this type of insturction with Novices in the past, and it proved to be less of a challenge then than this year. I'll just say that I think we'll give this instruction type a break for a couple of years for Novices. Of course, the Novice class consists of both first- or second-time competitors as well as teams that have run for a couple of years, which makes balancing the instruction types a little bit of a challenge as an organizer. For instance, a few beginners were flummoxed by straight-line diagrams, while the way they were introduced was suitable for the majority of Novices. I think there are a few ways we can improve the instructions, such as running a (non-ORRC) beginner class, or providing a more thorough explanation (maybe a beginner's guidebook) at the beginning. (If you're one of these beginners, I'd appreciate any feedback you have on this point.)

While the "Hard" instructions were - er - hard, it is interesting to note that only one Intermediate crew decided to open the supplied panic envelope and take the 10 point penalty for doin so. (Our lone Expert team had the same instructions as the Intermediates, but since they never panic, they didn't need an envelope.) There was a question about how to interpret the straight-line waffle section, where each cell in a waffle was a straight-line segment. You start at a point in the waffle, and can only execute an adjoining instruction, selecting the appropriate one with a matching intersection type. The question was whether you should enter each segment from the top or bottom; while the first instruction set a precedent, and normally there would be no doubt in my mind about the remaining ones, the guru suggested adding this clarification for the similar section in the Novice instructions, so a clarification could have helped. I'll have to remember that for next time!

Summary and detailed results are given below, so I'll just highlight the top finishers here. For the record, provisional results were posted at 10:15 PM, and were declared final at 10:32 after a

couple of minor corrections. (Martin Loveridge did a great job as scorer, getting our results out a lot earlier than last year!)

Our lone Expert crew of Paul and Rita Moore managed to take the win in their class, after struggling against themselves (and the waffle) all night!

Tudor Horia and Mihai Chiriac took the win in their first event as Intermediates after being bumped into this class from Novice for 2006 - they were obviously ready for the move! Last year's Intermediate winners, Paul Leonard and Dave Jones, finished in a commendable second place.

The Novice class was quite hotly contested this year, with 15 Novices, and 5.3 points separating the top 4 competitors! Robinson Kelly and Sheena Disher started their winter rally season off on a good footing by winning the class with a score of only 5 points. Kyle Epp and Calvin Kwok were only 1.9 points behind, while Topy Link and Connie Williams took home third place trophies for their score of 9.4. Andrei Glotov and Natalia Glotova were only 0.9 points behind, in fourth place.

Once again this year, we used HAM radios to improve communications between crews, which helped quite a bit. Also key once again was tracking cell phone numbers of competitors and crews - we once again used cell phones to track down one car that didn't show up at a checkpoint (we weren't leaving anyone behind!), and car 19 called the organizers when they got stuck in the mud that was just off-route. So this proved to be a very effective practice, and one that I would recommend to other organizers as well.

It seems a little obvious to state it this way, but our event just wouldn't run without the effort of the people who volunteered their Saturday to help out - I truly appreciate their hard work and their time. I'm just going to say thanks for the hard work to the workers listed below, and also to my co-organizer, Dietmar, and Robert Roaldi as ORRC Guru who reviewed the event. (And accurately predicted the hard sections!)

Top Ten Tax Tips

1. File your taxes on time to avoid the 5% late filing penalty.

If you owe tax for 2004, and do not file your return for 2004 by midnight of May 2, 2005, CCRA will charge a 5% late-filing penalty.

If you or your spouse or common-law partner carried on a business in 2004 your 2004 tax return has to be filed by **June 15, 2005**. However, if you have a balance owing for 2004, you still have to pay it by May 2, 2005.

2. Receive your tax deduction automatically every month.

You can ask CCRA to allow your employer to reduce withholdings if you have contributed to an RRSP early in the year, made large charitable donations, or incurred substantial medical expenses. Child care expenses, alimony and taxable child support also may lower your income and reduce your withholding taxes.

3. Take advantage of Income Splitting Opportunities:

- a. Split income by employing your spouse or child.
- b. Lend money to your spouse or child.
- c. Have the lower income spouse invest all earnings

d. <u>Maxmize your charitable deductions</u> (amounts over \$200) by pooling your charitable receipts for up to five years and have the higher income spouse claim them.

- 4. Try to earn your investment income (outside of RRSPs) at the lowest tax rate possible.
- 5. Pay the premiums on your disability insurance.
- 6. <u>Claim medical expenses</u> on the tax return of the spouse with the lowest income.
- 7. Make use of your investment losses.
- 8. Defer tax on severance or retiring allowance.
- 9. <u>Transfer shares</u> to your RRSP, but not at a loss.

10. Make sure you deduct your <u>safety deposit box fees</u>. and all investment carrying charges if you have an investment loan (outside your RRSP).
